GLOUCESTER, July 27.—John D. Rockefeller, Jr., paid a short visit to Gloucester to hear the new carillon of bells installed in Our Lady of Good Voyage church, which were played for the first time on Sunday. Accompanied by his secretary, Mr. Rockefeller came by train from his summer home at Seal Harbor, Me.

After an inspection of the church property and the playing balcony, the party went to the top of Mount Vernon hill, near, where a half hour's concert was given for the benefit of the visitor.

Mr. Rockefeller, it is understood, is interested in the purchase of a similar set of chimes for a New York church. After remaining here he went to Boston.
